



The Hearing Ear

Hearing the voice of God is my greatest delight. There is nothing worse than silence when I'm in the midst of confusion and conflict. That is the time when I must choose to stop what I'm doing (normally spinning in my soul trying to figure out answers rather than hearing and obeying God) and get quiet. If things are too "loud" in my own head I have to shut off my own thoughts and search for the voice of the Holy Spirit. Unlike the patriarchs in the old covenant, we have the Holy Spirit residing on the inside of us. Back when they walked the planet only one man at a time could have the Holy Spirit rest upon him. The Holy Spirit would come and go and recalling what the law and the prophets shared, it was a hard thing to have His presence leave. The Spirit NEVER leaves or forsakes us now. He's in us for the long haul. We now have the ability to have the Spirit of God living within us and controlling (if allowed) our hearts and minds on a perpetual basis. Now mind you it takes discipline to be Holy Spirit controlled. It requires "knowing" God like a husband and wife know each other. It requires constant continual communion with Him. How else would we recognize and hear His voice?



Our God has promised to be with us in trouble. I continually repeat this truth to myself when trouble shows its ugly head. It doesn't say a thing about HOW the trouble comes; it simply says He is with us in trouble! Most of the trouble I am in is of my own design and making. Occasionally it's from some outside source, but whether I orchestrated the mess I'm in or it comes from the other side of the planet matters not. God is with me. I must choose to believe the truth and then if I really believe it I act on that belief.

So God lives in me. Giving Him full reign and letting Him use the reins is my next goal. That requires I learn to receive His words and again act upon them.

There are people who claim that they are Christians and also say that they NEVER hear God’s voice. I would say that they are in either one of two categories; either they don’t know God and aren’t His sheep OR they are His sheep, but have turned off their hearing button by ignoring Him early on. Either way I’m sure they do hear the adversary and feel condemned most of the time. There is a remedy for both situations. No one has to remain in the spiritually deaf category, whether through ignorance that God loves and has a plan for life and living or through stubborn rebellion God is patient and long suffering. He can make a way where they seemingly is NO way!

When we get in a place of spiritual deafness there are signs. Rebellion to God’s will doesn’t happen overnight. God doesn’t give up on us easily. His mercy is new every morning and He doesn’t want anyone to perish or live in misery. He is working in us constantly to will and to do of His good pleasure! (Philippians 2:13)

Once there was a young man. He lived with his father, brother and their servants outside of a small rural town. He would travel to town from time to time to get supplies for their farm. The farm was quite large, but the town was not. His father was quite wealthy and he had many servants. He treated the servants with respect and loved both his sons. When they would travel to town the younger of the two boys heard the other boys talk about the “big city”. The more times he traveled to town the more interested he became in the “big city”. It sounded like a fun place with so many exciting things to do. He decided to make friends with some of the boys in town so he could learn more about the “big city”. The more he listened to his friends the *less he cared to hear what his father would say*. Before long his father’s words were *irritating to him*. “Son I need you to go into town and get some feed for the animals. Oh, and while you’re there don’t forget to stop and take this package to your grandmother. She’s very old and it has her medicine in it.” The young man could hardly wait to get to town, but not to do the things his father asked of him, but to see *his* friends and make *his* own plans. His father’s words simply gave him a reason to escape. He was planning to leave home and find *his* way in the “big city” and explore the world. When he got to town he quickly bought *some* of the supplies his father had asked for, but he completely *forgot* the package he was supposed to deliver to his grandmother. As soon as his wagon was full of feed, he parked it and ran to his favorite haunt to find *his* friends. Their plan was made and *he* resolved to tell his father after he delivered the feed that he was leaving.

Sound familiar? It’s my rendition of the prodigal son. Trouble comes as a result of a process of being enticed of our *own lusts*, turning off and tuning out to God and then following the voices that lured us away in the first place. Little by little

the voice of the Father has less and less significance to us. We do our own thing and end up in trouble. We become cynical, bitter, and hard hearted. Because we “hear” with our hearts or spirits as believers, the adversary works to harden our hearts so we’ll end up only hearing with natural ears. He gives us sinful suggestions or temptations (specifically geared towards our own likes and desires) and if we entertain those thoughts takes us captive at his will. If we listen to the adversary he will basically sit down on the throne of our hearts and begins slowly to take over. In the beginning it is pleasurable, but in the end we can’t even see the trees for the forest of confusion. All the while the Father is calling us back home and offering forgiveness and reconciliation. The more we shut out His offers of reconciliation, the harder our hearts grow. Like little pharaohs ignoring the plagues of Egypt, we try to dismiss the warning signs. We grow more and more rebellious and determined to do things our own way. Young and innocent childlike faith is replaced by old, bitter, cynical unbelief. Our spiritual ears are blocked with the wax of apathy.



Good news, God is still there! When the money is gone, when the friends have scattered, when the belly is roaring with hunger and the pig swill looks appetizing, we can run to God and fall at His feet and He will receive us with a robe, a ring and a fatted calf.

There are always two choices in life; the choice to hear God and obey or not. God doesn’t tempt His children. He can’t sin so temptation being sin comes from one source. Sin is always selfish. If we are tempted to do something for selfish motives guess who is behind it? The job of God is to love, create, provide, protect, save, heal and deliver. Our job is to hear and obey. If we hear and obey we can easily receive the love, the creative provision, protection, salvation, healing and deliverance from God. If we don’t hear and obey we’ll end up working to get love, working to make a living, working to protect ourselves, save ourselves, heal ourselves and deliver ourselves out of trouble. Hearing God and obeying creates an atmosphere of rest. It’s far easier to simply start out doing what God wants than to get free from our self motivated plans, but in the event of doing things our own way we can run to God and obtain grace (favor) and mercy to help in time of need. (Hebrews 4:16)

The first step to turning back to God is recognition of how good God is. God isn’t the condemner, He is the Savior! He makes a way of escape from temptation. Run to the throne of Grace. Run to the Father. Expect to obtain grace AND mercy. He says to go BOLDY! He put all the consequences of sin upon Yeshua/Jesus! Another good place to begin to turn back to God is to ask Him to remind you of the LAST instructions He

gave you that you ignored or refused to obey. Realize that it is GOD who is working in you even now both to will and to do of HIS good pleasure! Let Him work the work of reconciliation in your heart. He's ready to throw a party, but you have to attend it for the party to begin. You can truly hear His voice IF you're willing.

Mark 10: 14 Suffer the little children to come unto me, and forbid them not: for of such is the kingdom of God.


